Your tour

This tour combines the most spectacular section of the Altmühl cycle path with the Danube and the quiet Wellheimer Valley, which was formed by the original course of the Danube. Two boat trips enable you to enjoy the scenery from the water. The medieval towns of Regensburg, Ingolstadt and Eichstätt are the cultural highlights of this circular tour which is first and foremost characterised by its scenery and charm.

- → Closest airports: Munich
- → Train station: Regensburg Hauptbahnhof (main station)

Parking in Regensburg

- → Public car parks, costs approx. 10 20 EUR / day.
- → Hotel parking spaces (available in individual hotels, chargeable, details in the travel documents).

Bike handover

→ Arrival: Guests' rental bikes will be available at the arrival hotel.

Departure: The guests leave the bikes at the last hotel. If an e-bike has been rented, the battery, charger and key must be returned to the reception.

Luggage transport

→ Luggage pick-up from 09.00 a.m., delivery to the next hotel by 06.00 p.m. at the latest, labeling of luggage is 1 x for the whole tour. No restriction on the number of pieces of luggage, but max. 20 kg per piece of luggage.

Travel documents

- → 1 set (per booked room) consists of: hotel list and voucher, travel information with details on daily stages, short travel guides and route descriptions, maps, luggage tags
- → Dispatched up to four weeks before arrival. For short-term bookings, delivery to the start hotel, hotel list and arrival information will be sent by email

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Regensburg

Your tour begins in Regensburg, the most northern town on the Danube. This town is considered Germany's best preserved city and has been declared a UNESCO Heritage Site. Take some time to explore the lovely parks and gardens as well as the historic old town.

Day 2: Regensburg – Abensberg / Bad Gögging, approx. 55 / 50 km + boat trip

You start your cycling tour going upstream to Kelheim, where Mother Nature has something special in store in the form of the Danube Gap. Many, many years ago, the Danube curved its way through the massive Jura rocks here. Today you follow the Danube through this narrow passageway by boat. In the beer garden of Weltenburg Monastery, fortify yourself for the next section of the tour.

Day 3: Bad Gögging – Neuburg, approx. 65 / 60 km

You have a leisurely cycle through fields of hops to Ingolstadt, not only the seat of the Audi works but also a very well preserved old Bavarian fortress town. Over 500 years ago, the Bavarian Purity Law on beer was passed here. In Neuburg, you'll see one of the most beautiful renaissance castles along the Danube.

Day 4: Neuburg - Eichstätt, ca. 60 km

Today you cycle from the Danube to the Altmühl by way of Wellheim valley, which was originally created by the original course of the Danube. You dip into unspoiled nature with clear views of the scenery - dry grassland and impressive rock formations, for which the Altmühl valley is well known. You follow this path from Dollnstein to Eichstätt.

Day 5: Eichstätt – Beilngries, approx. 45 km

In Eichstätt take the opportunity before you leave to visit the Jura museum, which has lots of fossils of dinosaurs from the area. Your cycle tour today takes you through a juniper heath in Altmühltal valley to your destination, the charming town of Beilngries.

Day 6: Beilngries - Essing / Kelheim, ca. 40 / 50 km

From Dietfurt, you follow the Altmühl in the bed of the Main-Danube canal and soon reach Prunn Castle, which towers majestically over the river. In Kelheim you reach the end of today's section - which is also the end of the Altmühl. From here it flows into the Danube. If your legs aren't wobbling too much, go and visit the Hall of Liberation, which offers great views of the area.

Day 7: Kelheim - Regensburg, approx. 50 / 40 km

Before you set off to Regensburg, it's worth making the effort to cycle up to the Hall of Liberation, where you have incredible views of the area. Continue at a more leisurely pace on to Regensburg, where you reach the most northerly point of the Danube. This town is considered Germany's best-preserved city and has been declared a UNESCO Heritage Site.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
