Your tour

With boat and bike you can get to know the Danube between Passau and Vienna in a special way. Unlike the classic bike tour on the Danube Cycle Route, packing your suitcase every day is not necessary. The spacious riverboat accompanies you on your tour from Passau to Vienna and back to Passau. You will cover some sections on board, so that you can comfortably cover the entire route in one week. You will discover the idyllic landscapes around the Schlögener Schlinge, the Wachau and the Strudengau. The highlight is certainly the Austrian capital Vienna, whose historic center with St. Stephen's Cathedral, MuseumsQuartier and Hofburg is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Passau, Passau – Engelhartszell (boat)

You start the great cruise on the Danube by bike and ship in the three-river city of Passau, where the Danube, Inn and Ilz flow together. Arrive early enough to marvel at the worlds largest church organ in St. Stephans Cathedral and take a stroll through the charming old town. You can check in on the ship until 16.00 and it is time to cast off as early as 17.00!

Day 2: Engelhartszell – Brandstatt, approx. 45 km

Don't miss out on a visit to Engelszell Abbey before you set off on your first stage of cycling. The monasterys liqueurs and beers are famous throughout Austria. A few kilometers later, you cycle through the impressive natural spectacle of the Schlögener Schlinge. In the U-shaped river loop, the Danube turns 180 degrees - impressive. You can enjoy the most beautiful view of the loop from the Schlögener Blick, which you can reach on foot from Schlögen. You then cycle on to Brandstatt. The MS Swiss Crown is already waiting for you.

Day 3: Brandstatt - Linz, approx. 25 km, Linz - Tulln (boat)

Today you set off on a short stage of your journey by bike and boat along the Austrian Danube. This gives you plenty of time to get to know Linz, Austrias third largest city. In the middle of the 20th century, Linz had a reputation as a dusty steel town. This changed in 2009 at the latest, when it was named European Capital of Culture together with Vilnius. In addition to the Ars Electronica Center and the Lentos Art Museum, the city offers a wealth of other cultural sites worth seeing and a varied cultural program. From Linz, the tour continues by boat to Tulln.

Day 4: Tulln - Vienna, approx. 30 km

Off to Vienna! On the way, it is worth stopping at Klosterneuburg Abbey. You will recognize the towers of the monastery, which was founded 900 years ago, from afar. The Verdun Altar in the Leopold Chapel is a highlight of medieval goldsmithing. Now it is only a few kilometers to the Austrian capital. If you like, you can enjoy a classical waltz and operetta concert (not included) at Schönbrunn Palace in the evening. The palace is one of the most beautiful baroque palaces in Europe.

Day 5: Rest day in Vienna, Vienna – Wachau (boat)

Today the ship stays in place until the evening, so you can explore the Austrian capital at your own leisure. Discover the idyllic old town with its many historic buildings and monuments as well as beautiful squares and lovingly restored houses. Indulge your palate with delicious specialities in one of the many traditional coffee houses before returning to the ship. In the late evening, you will sail overnight in the Wachau to Dürnstein or Rossatz.

Day 6: Wachau / Krems - Melk, approx. 40 km, Melk - Grein (boat)

Today, the Wachau is the focus of your journey by bike and boat along the Austrian Danube. The region is one of the most picturesque in the country and is characterized by a hilly landscape and steep vineyards. Along the Danube, you can also get to know historic places such as the baroque town of Dürnstein and immerse yourself in the Middle Ages at the legendary Aggstein castle ruins. Another highlight awaits you

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at your destination for the day, Melk. Melk Abbey is one of the most beautiful Baroque buildings in Austria. In the evening, the ship sets sail for Grein.

Day 7: Grein – Mauthausen, approx. 35 km, Mauthausen – Passau (boat)

Before you get on your bike today, it is worth taking a stroll through the charming little town of Grein. Greinburg Castle in particular will attract your attention. It is the oldest inhabited castle in Austria and can be visited as part of a guided tour. Through the hinterland of the Strudengau region, you pass Clam Castle and the Celtic village of Mitterkirchen on your way to Mauthausen. There you have the opportunity to visit the Mauthausen concentration camp memorial.

Day 8: Individual departure from Passau

Once again you will enjoy the morning silence of this impressive river on your journey by bike and boat on the Danube, before you reach Passau at around 11:00 am. After disembarking, you will start your individual journey home.

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
