From your hotel in Poreč, you will explore the hinterland of Istria on various day tours. You cycle along the northern Adriatic coast, visit charming little towns in the interior and cycle to picturesque villages on the coast. The cycling holiday is a perfect combination of historical settlements and colourful nature. Marvel at the Euphrasius Basilica in Poreč, the Euphemia Church in Rovinj and the amphitheatre in Pula. Croatia will enchant you with its green forests, blue rivers, rocky coasts and beautiful cities.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Poreč

Your cycling vacation in Croatia begins on the west coast of the Istrian peninsula, in the coastal town of Poreč. Don't miss a visit to the Euphrasian Basilica here. It has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1997. Personal tour information and bike handover take place in the evening.

Day 2: Round tour Poreč, approx. 35 km

On your first tour by bike, you will cycle through Poreč's hinterland. You cycle along the coast to Santa Marina di Vabriga and finally to Vabriga. Visnjan, a small town (in Istria), awaits you inland. You cycle back to Poreč along mostly traffic-free side roads.

Day 3: Trip to the Limski Canal, approx. 40 km

You drive to the Limski Canal, which has been declared a nature reserve. The famous Limski Canal is very similar to a fjord and will take your breath away with its clear, blue water. The canal has a very high oxygen and low salt content, which is why there are many mussel and oyster farms on its banks. You return to Poreč through the inland.

Day 4: Excursion to the artist town of Grožnjan, approx. 55 km + transfer

After a short transfer, you reach the village of Grožnjan. Musicians and artists from all over the world are drawn here. Classical concerts are held here every summer. The Jazz is Back Festival is held in the second half of July. The Ex Tempore artists' meeting is organized at the end of September especially for the visual arts. You cycle downhill via Buje,

along the Adriatic coast to Novigrad. This small town lies at the mouth of the river Mirna and is surrounded by a fortress wall. Before you reach Poreč, you cycle past the Jama Baredine stalactite cave.

Day 5: Excursion to Motovun, approx. 45 km + transfer

After the transfer to Poreč's hinterland, you will make a stop in Motovun. This historic town is perched on a steep hill above the Mirna Valley. Walk around the historic town and look out over the sea, the Mirna valley and the hilly surroundings. Below Motovun is a vast, damp oak forest, a well-known white truffle discovery site. You cycle along the Parenzana to Vizinada. Take a look back at the beautiful Motovun and cycle on through the hinterland to Poreč.

Day 6: Stay in Poreč

Today of your cycling holiday in Croatia is at your leisure. Spend time at one of the beaches close to the city and take a long walk along the promenade and through the old town. Discover the three remaining towers of the city fortifications that were built between the 12th and 16th centuries. In the evening, restaurants entice you with Istrian dishes and local wines, as well as the atmospheric flair of the coastal town that was already settled by the Romans.

Day 7: Excursion to Kanfanar, Rovinj and Pula, approx. 60 km + transfer

After a short transfer, you will reach the village of Kanfanar. Continue to Rovinj. Until the 18th century, the city was an island in its own right. It is one of the most beautiful cities in Istria. The landmark of Rovinj is the

bell tower of the Church of St. Euphemia, which can be seen from afar. We continue to Fažana, a small fishing village from where you have the opportunity to visit the Brijuni Islands. Next stop is Pula, the largest city in Istria. Visit the famous amphitheater and the Temple of Augustus before returning to Poreč by transfer in the evening.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
