Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Dijon

Famous for Dijon mustard and delicious Burgundy wines, Dijon is the starting point of your cycling tour. The former home town of the Dukes of Burgundy has much to offer. Explore the beautiful, historic city with the Gothic Collegiate Church of Notre Dame and the Ducal Palace on the semi-circular Place de la Libération.

Day 2: Dijon – Beaune, approx. 45 km

In the morning, your tour starts in the direction of Beaune. You cycle through Marsannay-la-Côte to Vougeot, to the famous Clos de Vougeot with the Château worth seeing. You cycle along beautiful little vineyard roads to Nuits-Saint-Georges, where a delicious wine tasting awaits you. Then continue to Beaune, famous for the historic Hôtel Dieu, a former hospital.

Day 3: Beaune – Chassey-le-Camp, approx. 40 km

Your day today takes you towards the great wine villages of Pommard and Meursault. In Pommard, you first leave the wine-growing area to cycle through the Haute Côte de Beaune with the picturesque villages of Saint Romain or La Rochepot. Grandiose views await you before you cycle again through the large wine-growing areas on the plain towards today's destination.

Day 4: Chassey-le-Camp – Cluny, approx. 65 km

From the Côte de Beaune, you cycle today to the Côte Châlonnais. In the lovely countryside, you will have the opportunity to visit some of Burgundy's famous wash houses from the 19th century. In the afternoon, you cycle along a former railway line, the so-called Voie verte. Passing the Château Cormatin, you will reach Cluny with its medieval abbey, which is well worth seeing.

Day 5: Cluny – Tournus, approx. 40 km

If you have not yet visited the monastery complex in the spiritual centre of Cluny, you should definitely do so in the morning. Afterwards, you cycle through the somewhat hilly but also very picturesque route to Tournus, a pretty little town with a beautiful Romanesque church in the centre.

Day 6: Tournus – Chalon-sur-Saône, approx. 35 km

Today's route takes you over small hilly sections, touching Brionnais with its Romanesque churches and beautiful valleys. Your stage destination on the Saône is best known for the theatre festival Châlons dans la Rue. The historic old town around the 15th century St. Vincent Cathedral is also worth seeing.

Day 7: Chalon-sur-Saône – Beaune – Dijon, approx. 50 km + train ride

Along the Canal du Centre, the only canal in Burgundy authorised for inland navigation, you cycle via Chagny back to Beaune, which, in addition to the Hôtel Dieu, still offers many sights such as the basilica or the old town framed by the city wall. Afterwards, you will take a leisurely train ride to Dijon.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
