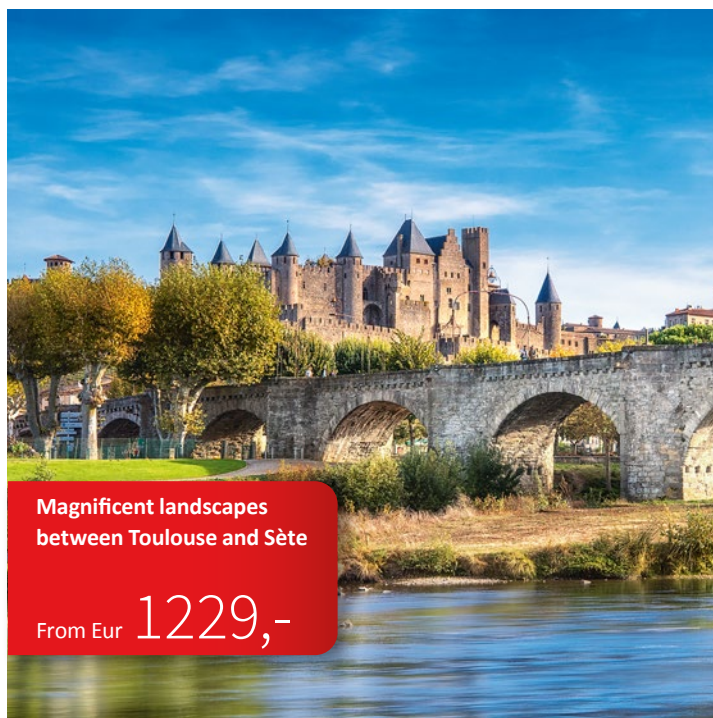

- Return to Toulouse: Optional by minibus (min. 2 people, max. 6 people) from Sète (Mondays and Saturdays only), must be specified when booking.
- Alternatively on your own by train, connections several times a day, without changing trains.
- Twin / double rooms / separate beds are only occasionally available. We treat requests as non-binding customer requests, if above mentioned room types are a booking condition, it must be mentioned as a condition at the time of booking.

## Stages description

### Day 1: Individual arrival in Toulouse

If you arrive early in Toulouse, you will have the time to explore this busy ville rose. Toulouse was given this name because of the many buildings here made of red brick. For example St-Sernin Basilica, which is one of the most beautiful Roman churches in the south of France. There is an informational meeting in the meeting, where you also pick up your hire bikes, ready for your cycling holiday along the Canal du Midi.

### Day 2: Toulouse – Castelnaudary, approx. 60 km

Pedal out of the busy town and into beautiful countryside. Enjoy the peace and quiet and the wonderful views of the canal and the passing boats. You get to Lauragais, fertile levels which are also known as the pays de Cocagne, which literally means land of milk and honey! You cycle through villages very typical of the south of France to Castelnaudary. In what used to be a town of mills you will discover the moulin de Cugarel, which is still intact today.

### Day 3: Castelnaudary – Mirepoix, approx. 50 km

Impressive medieval towns will be on your route today. There is a museum in Bram which exhibits archaeological findings from the area. Carcassonne and its Cité, impressive fortifications, will whisk you away to days gone by. Up to 4000 people lived here during the Middle Ages, behind the city wall, which was some three kilometres in length. Wander down the narrow streets and enjoy watching the hustle and bustle from one of the many cafes and restaurants, after you've visited the museum and walked around the wall.

### Day 4: Mirepoix – Carcassonne, approx. 60 km

Back through the countryside Ariège, a quiet and meditative agricultural landscape with rolling hills, to Carcassonne. There the imposing Cité awaits you, the largest fortified city in Europe, you are in the heart of the Cathars.

### Day 5: Excursion to Montolieu, approx. 40 km

At the edge of Montagnes Noires is the small town of Montolieu, situated on a rocky projection. Its nickname is the town of books as there are 15 antiquarian book shops here which accommodate 200,000 books. Michel Braibant museum tells the history of the book,

from the first writings to book printing. Not just book worms, but wine lovers will also like this town. Full-bodied red wines are produced here from the Syrah, Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon grapes.

### Day 6: Carcassonne – Olonzac / Homps, approx. 45 km

On your cycling holiday along the Canal du Midi you will be cycling through one of France's oldest wine-growing regions. The cycle paths in Minervois take you through beautiful countryside, usually up high and with lovely views down onto the vineyards. You cycle through old villages with Roman churches. Make sure you don't miss out on trying a glass of good wine. Match that with a good meal of fish or seafood, which you'll find in the many restaurants in Olonzac.

### Day 7: Olonzac – Narbonne, approx. 45 km

After just a short trip on your bike, it's worth taking a break after a few kilometres. The picturesque village of Homps, right on the Canal du Midi, has the third biggest harbour along the canal. You continue cycling until you get to the diocese town of Narbonne. In addition to the wonderful cathedral, visit the many Roman buildings and artefacts that you'll find in the town's streets.

### Day 8: Narbonne – Béziers, approx. 45 km

You drive via Capestang to Béziers, passing the famous Canal Tunnel. Once a rich wine metropolis, as evidenced by its many magnificent buildings, Béziers is also the birthplace of Paul Riquet, the builder of the Canal du Midi. The archbishop's palace watches over the city, the attraction on the canal are the Neuf Écluses, the Nine Locks.

### Day 9: Béziers – Sète, approx. 65 km

The further you cycle, the saltier the air becomes. The bike path leads directly along the sea toward Sète, the largest French fishing town on the Mediterranean, also called „Little Venice of the Languedoc“ because of its many canals. Here, an evening stroll can be excellently combined with a good meal; the town's origins are Italian - and so is its cuisine.

### Day 10: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
