
Cycling Holiday in Piedmont

Your tour

On this tour, enjoyment and cycling fun are clearly in the foreground. You start in Turin, Italy's fourth largest city, which boasts a rich cultural scene. On the way, you will cycle through Piedmont, known for its sun-drenched red wines, delicious traditional dishes and picturesque landscapes. Cosy, idyllic villages and lively towns like Asti and Alba perfectly round off your stay in Piedmont. The tour is suitable for already experienced cyclists who do not shy away from intermittent climbs and descents.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Turin

Turin is the capital of the Piedmont region and the ideal starting point for your bike tour to the Riviera. In a unique location, surrounded by snow-capped Alpine peaks, lies the former capital of Italy. Many magnificent palazzi and large squares remind of the royal past.

Day 2: Turin – Capriglio region, approx. 35 km + Bus or train ride

Your first day of cycling begins with a bus or train transfer (included) to Superga. The sanctuary, located a few kilometers outside of Turin, is reminiscent of the Pantheon in Rome because of its size and decor. Enjoy the sweeping view of Turin all the way to the Alps before getting on your bike. You'll cycle through the typical Piedmontese countryside lined with vineyards from one enchanting place to the next. You will spend the night in a country house characteristic of the region.

Day 3: Capriglio – Asti, approx. 30 km

The second stage of your cycling vacation in Piedmont will take you through small mountain villages to Asti. On the way you will be offered again and again a magnificent view over the breathtaking landscape of the Piedmont. The town of Asti is famous for its sparkling wine Asti Spumante, which is made from white muscat vines. It is not only wine that is highly prized in and around Asti. Good cheese, refined pasta and risotto dishes make the city and the region a culinary paradise for gourmets. Well fortified, a walk through the medieval city center is worthwhile. Experience Asti's medieval charm with a glass of Barbera d'Asti.

Day 4: Asti – Canelli, approx. 35 km

Today you leave Asti in a southerly direction. Accompanied by extensive vineyards and dreamlike natural landscapes you cycle to Nizza Monferrato. While sipping a cappuccino, listen to the ringing of the bells of the imposing town hall tower El campanone in the piazza. Continue. You will spend the night in an agriturismo near Canelli. The simple but stylish accommodations in the countryside are on par with standard hotels. Look forward to the day ahead over local specialties and regional wines.

Day 5: Canelli – Alba, approx. 40 km

Your cycling vacation in Piedmont will take you to Alba today. Expect some climbs and descents along the way. A longer break is worthwhile in Neive. The mountain village is one of the borghi più belli d'Italia, the most beautiful villages in Italy. Barbaresco, surrounded by vineyards, is also worth a stop. Visit one of the town's numerous wineries and taste the red wine Barbaresco Riserva, the little brother of the world-famous Barolo. Another treat awaits you in Alba. The town is famous for its white truffles and chocolate specialties. Browse the delicatessen stores for delicate wines and typical local delicacies.

Day 6: Alba – Montafia, approx. 45 km

You leave Alba and cross the river Tànaro to the north. Take a break in Canale. It is no coincidence that the town calls itself the capital of the Piedmont peach. More than 100 years ago, wine crop failures were compensated with the cultivation of peaches. With success, because today the peaches of Canale are known beyond the country's borders. Another treat awaits you at the Enoteca Regionale del Roero. Local wine producers offer their fine wines for tasting here. Through forests and along small streams you cycle to Montafia. Enjoy the rural atmosphere before cycling to turbulent Turin tomorrow.

Day 7: Montafia – Turin, approx. 50 km

The last stage of your cycling vacation in Piedmont will take you back to your starting point in Turin. Visit the Mole Antonelliana. The tower, which is about 168 meters high, is one of the city's landmarks. A panoramic elevator takes you to the observation deck, from which you have a wonderful view over the city. Another highlight of Turin is the Museo Egizio. Discover numerous Egyptian treasures and immerse yourself in the fascinating world of the pharaohs. Or how about visiting the Museo Nazionale dell' Automobile? Located just outside the city center, the museum takes you on an exciting journey into the history of the automobile.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
