Your tour

The bike tour in the Wachau has a lot to offer. Enjoy a week in one of the most beautiful regions of Austria. The first days you stay in Krems and explore the region from there. You cycle along the three rivers Danube, Kamp and Traisen and encounter the baroque old town of St. Pölten, the magnificent Benedictine abbey Stift Melk, the Renaissance castle Rosenberg and the Roman town of Tulln. The region is also internationally renowned for its wines. After a tour through the breathtaking landscape with its numerous vineyards and orchards, you should definitely stop at a typical Austrian wine tavern. Here, the winegrowers pour their wine directly in the winery! You will spend the last two nights in Vienna and get to know the city during a discovery tour.

- All bookings are on request.
- In Austria, helmets are compulsory for children up to the age of 12.
- Return journey to Krems: Optionally by minibus (daily), duration approx. 1 - 1.5 hours, pick-up approx. 10 am directly at the hotel, must be specified when booking.
- Alternatively on your own by train, connections several times a day, duration approx. 1.5 hours, without changing trains.
- Twin / double rooms / separate beds are only occasionally available. We treat requests as non-binding customer requests, if above mentioned room types are a booking condition, it must be mentioned as a condition at the time of booking.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival to Krems

The starting point of your cycle tour in the Wachau is Krems - the 1000-year-old town on the Danube. If you still feel the need for exercise after your journey, an evening stroll through the town is a good idea. If you want to warm up for the next few days, a short cycle tour to Göttweig Abbey is also suitable. Spend a cosy evening in one of the many restaurants.

Day 2: Krems – St. Pölten – Krems, approx. 40 km + train ride

Your first cycle tour in the Wachau begins with a relaxing train journey to the Lower Austrian capital of St. Pölten - one of the oldest cities in Austria. Allow enough time to explore the baroque old town. The cycle tour takes you along the Traisental cycle path through varied landscapes in the Mostviertel region. Via Herzogenburg you reach Traismauer, from where you cycle along the Danube back to Krems.

Day 3: Krems – Melk – Krems, approx. 40 km + boat trip

In the morning, it's time to cast off! From Krems, you will cruise comfortably along the Danube to Melk, where you will visit the magnificent Benedictine Abbey of Melk Abbey. You should not miss out on an extensive stroll through the town. Cycle leisurely along the Danube cycle path through the breathtaking landscape of the Wachau - orchards and vineyards as far as the eye can see. In Weißenkirchen, take the opportunity to sample wines from the region before returning to Krems. Cheers!

Day 4: Krems – Rosenberg – Krems, approx. 45 km + train ride

Today's stage of the cycle tour in the Wachau first takes you by train to Rosenberg. You should not miss out on a detour to the Renaissance castle there. Originally built as a castle around 1150, it was largely demolished in the 16th century and rebuilt on the same site as a castle

with 13 towers. After the Traisen and the Danube, today you cycle along the Kamp back to Krems. Langenlois, Austria's largest wine town, is the perfect place to make another stop.

Day 5: Krems – Tulln – Vienna, approx. 40 km + train ride

You leave the rural Wachau region in the direction of the imperial city of Vienna. You start the day with a short train journey from Krems to the Roman town of Tulln. Visit the Egon Schiele Museum there and learn about the town's most famous painter. Take the Danube cycle path to reach Vienna in a relaxed manner. During an evening stroll through the city, you can explore the first monuments of the historic city centre.

Day 6: Excursion to the Weinviertel, approx. 40 km or explore Vienna by bike, approx. 25 km

On your last day of cycling, you are spoilt for choice. Would you like to escape the big city once again? No problem! The neighbouring Weinviertel region is ideal for a round trip. Alternatively, you can explore the Austrian capital by bike. You should definitely have seen St Stephen's Cathedral, Schönbrunn Palace and Belvedere Palace, the Hofburg Palace and the Prater. Don't miss out on a slice of Sachertorte in one of the typical Viennese coffee houses.

Day 7: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
